Botanical Gardens / Biodome / Espace pour la Vie

[Espace pour la vie Montreal](#) groups the city's five natural history museums, Biodome, Biosphere, Insectarium, Botanical Garden and Planetarium.

Cost for entry for the individual museums is \$23.75 for adults (\$21.50 for 65 years+). [Group rates](#) are available for one or more museums and the [Espace pour la vie Montreal passport](#) provides unlimited access to all five museums for 12 months.

Approximate length of visits: Biodome (90 minutes), Biosphere (90 minutes), Insectarium (60-90 minutes), Planetarium (90 minutes), Botanical Garden: greenhouses (45 minutes), outdoor gardens (60-120 minutes).

The Biodome, Insectarium, Botanical Garden and Planetarium are located close to each other near the Olympic Park. Whereas the Biosphere is in Parc Jean Drapeau on St Helen's Island.

The [Espace pour la vie App](#) currently provides guides to improve your visit to the Biodome or Insectarium. Information about the Botanical Garden, Planetarium and Biosphere will be added soon.

BIODOME

The [Biodome](#), home to over **2,500 animals representing about 150 different species** and **800 plant species**, offers an immersive visit through five ecosystems of the Americas under one roof: [Tropical Rainforest](#), [Gulf of St. Lawrence](#), [Laurentian Maple Forest](#), [Labrador Coast](#), and [Sub-Antarctic Islands](#)!

It is recommended that you download the Space for Life App before arriving at the Biodome. The mobile application is available for free on [Apple Store](#) and [Play Store](#). It is compatible with iOS and Android mobile platforms.

Allow 90 minutes to visit the Biodome.

The **Biodome** lends wheelchairs to visitors who request them. An elevator provides access to the Mezzanine, from where it is possible to see some ecosystems.

INSECTARIUM

The Insectarium is the first museum in North America where visitors can interact with butterflies and a variety of other live and naturalised insect species (some of which are free roaming). As they make their way through its exhibition spaces, visitors enjoy an immersive and educational experience that aims to transform the relationship that humans have with insects.

Allow 60-90 minutes to visit the Insectarium.

PLANETARIUM

Located near Biodome, the [Planetarium de Montréal](#) offers an innovative approach to astronomy where science and art come together. A wide range of films are screened on the 360° domes at its two theaters.

Allow 90 minutes to visit the Planetarium.

BIOSPHERE

The [Biosphere](#) is located in Parc Jean Drapeau on St Helen's Island. Designed by Buckminster Fuller, the geodesic dome originally housed the United States pavilion during Expo67.

The theme for the 2025-26 programme is [Connections](#), inviting visitors to explore the interactions between living beings and their environment. Highlights include exhibitions on future energies, complex ecosystems, essential insects, the climate crisis and international migrations, demonstrating the fragile balance that links us to our environment and each other.

Notre Dame Cathedral Tour

Walking Food Tour, Old Montreal

On this food-oriented tour, explore Old Montreal (Vieux-Montréal) with a local, certified guide to go beyond the typical tourist haunts. Visit key sights such as the Place d'Armes and Saint Paul Street (Rue Saint-Paul). Enjoy gastronomic delights, including Montreal-style bagels, local cheeses, delicious canelés, and poutine.

Walking Tour, Old Montreal

Find out about all the eras that shaped Montreal with this walking tour of Old Montreal by Guidatour. Walk the streets of Old Montreal, stop at many historic sites such as Place d'Armes, and Place Jacques-Cartier, admire the stunning architecture of buildings such as Notre-Dame Basilica and the Chateau Ramezay, hear amusing anecdotes that reveal the secrets of Montreal and experience the French culture. This 2-hour guided tour is led by a certified guide who will bring the city's unique joie de vivre to life.
