




## SNAPSHOT OF SCHOLARSHIP ACTIVITY ACROSS THE COUNTRY:

- CFUW Moncton offers Education Awards for mature women (at least 21 years old and have been out of school for at least 1 year) who are going to university (\$1500) or college (\$750), for any year of any program of their choice.
- CFUW South Delta offers scholarships at the university level, high school bursaries, mature student bursaries, and as of 2022, the club's Indigenous Outreach Group has awarded funds annually to the Urban Native Youth Association (UNYA), Youth Empowerment Fund.
- **CFUW Kelowna** offers two \$1000 bursaries for **single mothers** with one or more dependent children, in a university transfer, degree or diploma program at the Kelowna Campus of Okanagan College.
- **CFUW Edmonton** has awarded over \$1,389,216 to University of Alberta students to date.
- CFUW Peterborough offers the Dr. Agnes Moffat-Magee Award of \$100 to elementary students participating in the Peterborough Regional Science Fair
- CFUW Aurora/Newmarket offers the York Region Children's Aid Society Award: two \$2500 awards to female students who are a former Crown ward of York Region Children's Aid Society (York CAS); currently receiving services from YRCAS; transitioning out of YRCAS care in the coming year.
- AFDU Montérégie offers scholarships at the high school, CEGEP, and trade school level including École de joaillerie de Montréal for jewelry design and fabrication.

## **EDUCATION**

- A big education advocacy win this year: <u>Bill C-35</u> and the federal-provincial-territorial agreement on the Canada-Wide Early Learning and Childcare project
- <u>CFUW submitted a brief</u> to the Standing Committee on the Status of Women at the House of Commons on Bill C-35.
- The Education Committee and the Indigenous Issues Subcommittee hosted a great webinar this year: Allyship, Privilege and Change with guest speaker, Dr. Cynthia Wesley-Esquimaux.




## OTHER EDUCATION EVENTS



CFUW (represented by National Advocacy Coordinator, Paige Inglis) took part in the Inclusive Child Care For All Summit on May 5th & 6th in Ottawa - hosted by Oxfam Canada, Child Care Now and the Childcare Resource and Research Unit. The summit's aim was to strategize on how to ensure that access to childcare becomes more equitable and inclusive as we see Canada-Wide Early Learning and Childcare (CWELCC) implemented. Advocates, researchers, child care workers and parents from underrepresented communities such as newcomers to Canada, racialized women and women with disabilities shared their lived experiences and swapped advocacy strategies.

### **COMMITTEE AND SUBCOMMITTEE WORK**

- Policy Book Subcommittee updating the French policy book, proposed to archive select policies, updated the Advocacy Action Document
- Environment Subcommittee engaged in virtual COP 27 and COP15 on Biodiversity in Montreal, prepared earth day newsletter, pre-AGM webinar
- Status of Women and Human Rights Subcommittee researched and met with relevant partners on the topic of sex work, publication bans, and continued to track the implementation of recent resolutions on women's issues

## **ADVOCACY**





- **CFUW joined the** #Act4QueerSafety Momentum campaign to ask the federal government to take action on anti-2SLGBTQIA+ hate
- CFUW was part of the <u>#Women4GunControl coalition</u>, led by NAWL and met with the Minister of Public Safety on Bill C-21: the ban on assault-style firearms
- CFUW staff met with staff at the Department of Justice and discussed sex offenders registry, publication bans and bail reform as part of a larger consultation effort with women's organizations
  - A few weeks later, the Minister of Justice, The Honourable David Lametti, announced proposed bail reforms which would restrict bail for repeat violent offenders. <u>Learn about Bill C-48 here</u>
- CFUW's Call to Action on <u>Bill C-226</u>: An Act respecting the development of a <u>national strategy to assess</u>, prevent and address environmental racism and to <u>advance environmental justice</u>. Several clubs sent letters to their MP expressing their support for this bill. This bill has now passed through the House of Commons and is expected to pass in the Senate.
- Submission to Office of the High Commissioner of Human Rights at the UN: universal periodic review on environmental racism and violence against Indigenous women. Sent the report to various government partners, had meeting with Canadian Human Rights Commission to discuss advocacy strategy and relationship building.
- CFUW staff attended the House of Commons question period with CFUW
   Orillia and North York representatives for the reading in the House of
   Commons of CFUW Orillia's petition on bail reform

## UNITED NATIONS COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN 67

The UN Commission on the Status of Women (UNCSW) is the showcase of our <u>International Advocacy</u>. Work began in early fall with the submission of <u>CFUW's written statement</u>. CFUW held a successful in-person parallel event – "Evening the Odds in Digital Education for Marginalized Women and Girls,". We had 15 delegates who attended over 170 sessions. Read <u>Volume 1</u> and <u>Volume 2</u> of the Delegates' Reports.



#### **CAMEUS**

CAMEUS, a North American regional affiliation of GWI members: CFUW, WG-USA and FEMU of Mexico. CAMEUS amplifies our separate impacts in ECOSOC through joint research, presentation and follow-up of parallel sessions CSW. September 2022 CAMEUS presented a virtual panel previously presented at CSW66 entitled Forced Out by Climate Change? Proactive Planning in North America. AT CSW67 CAMEUS presented Digital Education: Lessons Learnt and Innovations Introduced. During 2022-23, CAMEUS prepared a Memorandum of Understanding to formalize the working arrangement of the three NFAs with a signing at the Mexican Mission during CSW67.

## INTERNATIONAL SERVICE PROJECT (ISP) 2023

CFUW's 2022-2023 partner was the Darakht-e-Danesh Library (DDL), a digital learning resource by <u>Canadian Women for Women in Afghanistan</u>. We hosted a webinar with them in November - of which you can learn about the project in the recording on <u>our youtube</u>.

### INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS



#### **GWITRIENNIAL**

In total, 37 CFUW members attended the virtual triennial. Seven CFUW members were elected to GWI committees. CFUW put forward amendments to the GWI constitution as well as the following five resolutions:

- Violence against women in Politics
- Post-Pandemic Recovery for Women and Girls
- A clean, healthy and sustainable environment is a human right
- Climate Emergency Declaration and Action Plans
- Single-Use Plastic and plastic packaging



#### INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT WEEK

For International Development Week in February, we hosted a movie entitled "Woman", with over 100 people attending virtually over three days. The documentary is part of Woman, a worldwide project giving a voice to 2,000 females across 50 different countries.



#### **UN AGENCY OBSERVER**

The role of the UN Agency Observer, currently held by CFUW member Sandy Thomson, was approved by the CFUW National Board in the Fall of 2022. This is an appointed position, serving the International Relations Committee. The role is to develop increased CFUW capacity internationally, especially in the UN agencies (primarily with UN Women).



## WOMEN, PEACE, AND SECURITY NETWORK OF CANADA (WPSN-C)

Participation in the WPSN-C gives CFUW access to participate in government consultations and civil society roundtables like the ones attended this year with Global Affairs Canada (GAC), Women and Gender Equality (WAGE) and the United Nations Special Representative to the Secretary-General (UNSRSG) on Sexual Violence in Conflict, Pramila Patten.




