International advocacy for access to education and the removal of barriers to learning, matters—all the time.

Throughout 2025, Graduate Women International (GWI) has widely distributing advocacy infographics to mark key international days and raising awareness of gender equality and the right to education for women and girls. These infographics have circulated across the GWI global network, among National Federations and Associations (NFAs), Independent Members, and partners, and have also been shared by advocacy platforms such as the Women's United Nations Report Network (WUNRN), extending GWI's reach into international policy and human rights communities. GWI's education advocacy tools are designed for continued use in classrooms, conferences, campaigns, and more. We encourage keeping these materials in circulation, ensuring sustained visibility of the issues and reinforcing GWI's role in advancing international commitments to education and gender equality.
