





ELECTION 2025

- With a Federal Election announced March 25, 2025 to be held April 28, 2025, CFUW National launched the Election 2025 Toolkit for Clubs to advocate for priority issues and promote voter engagement throughout the election period.
- Toolkit included:
 - How to engage in elections while being non-partisan
 - Resources to inform yourself and your community about parties' and candidates' positions
 - Advice on spotting election disinformation
 - Briefing materials and questions to ask candidates on CFUW's priority issues
 - A guide to hosting an All-Candidates Meeting
- CFUW also signed on to the **<u>Demand Better</u>** campaign: a national, non-partisan, bilingual awareness campaign powered by women's rights and gender justice organizations from across the country

UNITED NATIONS COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN 69

The IR Committee's preparations for CSW69 began in early fall, with the submission of CFUW's <u>written</u> <u>statement</u> on the main focus of the 69th session, the review and appraisal of the implementation of the <u>Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action</u>. CFUW hosted a successful parallel event: <u>Educating Women & Girls: Advancing their Empowerment & Equality</u>.

CAMEUS is a North American regional affiliation of GWI members: CFUW, WG-USA and FEMU of Mexico. During CSW69, CAMEUS hosted a virtual parallel event, "Recognizing Qualifications for Employment of Women Migrating to North America."



INTERNATIONAL SERVICE PROJECT (ISP) 2023/24

CFUW's 2024-2025 partner was the "She Belongs in School" project in partnership with 60 million girls.
Clubs and members of CFUW raised a total of \$16,162.23 to to purchase 2 mobile learning devices (MLLs) to help keep girls in school and educate students about their sexual and reproductive health.
